POSITION SUMMARY

The Trinity College Foundation Studies Program (ICFS) is a pre-university course that qualifies overseas students for entry to the University of Melbourne and other universities. English for Academ ic Purposes (EAP) is a core component of TCFS.

The EAP Foundations Programs prepare students for entry to the University of Melbourne, focusing on academic skills in writing, speaking, listening and reading.

The role of EAP teacher includes preparation and delivery of the curriculum, adm inistration of assessment and correction, report writing, staffin eetings to monitor the academ is perform ance of students, availability to students for consultation, and other duties relating to the subject and the broader program. Each academ is staffin ember is also expected to play a role in the delivery of the student mentoring program, including the delivery of student wellbeing sessions and ongoing pastoral support for students.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Essential:

- 1. Relevant tertiary qualification
- Dem onstrated work experience in teaching students English as a Second Language and/or English for Academ ic Purposes at Foundation Studies Level, VCE or University level
- 3. Capability of using and engaging students using digital technologies, the Trinity Learning Management Systems and the Microsoft Office Suite (Including Microsoft Teams), used by students in the Trinity classroom and incorporating this technology as part of the curriculum program.
- 4. High level interpersonal and communication skills (written and oral) at all levels within a culturally diverse education community or similar environment
- 5. Demonstrated experience maintaining confidential records and performing administrative tasks related to teaching.
- 6. Well-developed computer literacy skills with the ability to learn new systems.





- 7. An ability to relate to and actively support international students as they make the necessary transitions to Australian society and western pedagogical practices.
- 8. A commitment to academic excellence and an understanding of Australian educational practices
- 9. Dem onstrated willingness to be flexible and adaptable to changing teaching conditions.

Further Inform ation:

- Applicants must be Australian Citizens, Perm anent Residents or hold a valid work perm itorvisa. If called for interview evidence of status will be required
- Applicants will be required to bring originals or certified copies of academ ic and other qualifications if called for interview.
- The successful applicant must secure, or be in the process of securing, a Working with Children approval or equivalent registration.

KEY RESPONS B LITES

The EAP teacherwill:

- 1. Develop and follow a course of general English and/or study skills which incorporates sentence structure, paragraph and essay/report writing, gram matical structure, vocabulary development, listening and note taking, reading and speaking, and group work tasks.
- 2. Provide adequate academ ic assistance for students outside class time.
- 3. Mark hom ework assignments, classroom assessment pieces and exams.
- 4. Write term reports and mark exam inations.
- 5. Contribute to ongoing program developm ent.
- 6. Meet regularly and collaborate with colleagues.
- 7. Attend departm ental and all staffm eetings.
- 8. Participate in the College's Student Mentoring Program.
- 9. Contribute to the care of students in a way that is consistent with the school's duty of care and be the first point of contact in matters of pastoral care.
- 10. Inform the StudentWellbeing and Academ ic Adm inistration teams about any of their students that require attention to social, em otional and/or learning needs, and then assist in the ongoing monitoring of those students.
- 11. Assist in student orientation activities; and
- 12. Undertake relief teaching for staff on leave if available.
